

Lu 17:11 ¶ And it came to pass, as he went to Jerusalem, that he passed through the midst of Samaria and Galilee.

12 And as he entered into a certain village, there met him ten men that were lepers, which stood afar off:

13 And they lifted up their voices, and said, Jesus, Master, have mercy on us.

14 And when he saw them, he said unto them, Go shew yourselves unto the priests. And it came to pass, that, as they went, they were cleansed.

15 And one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, and with a loud voice glorified God,

16 And fell down on his face at his feet, giving him thanks: and he was a Samaritan.

17 And Jesus answering said, Were there not ten cleansed? but where are the nine?

18 There are not found that returned to give glory to God, save this stranger.

19 And he said unto him, Arise, go thy way: thy faith hath made thee whole.

Here we see only one of the lepers returning to give thanks for what Christ has done. The first nine were certainly being obedient to Christ's words in showing themselves to the priests as clean; even so, Jesus' instruction by no means implied that an expression of gratitude was out of line or a waste of time. Were the nine grateful for what had taken place? I can't help but believe that they were beside themselves with joy. Imagine how you would have felt! The difference is that they became so consumed with the present situation that they failed to reflect on what got them to this point of unimaginable joy.

Is this not our greatest problem too as it concerns our expressions of gratitude? I believe that we as Christians are truly thankful for the present state in which we find ourselves. But the reality is that all of us can rejoice quickly for our blessings without returning to consider the One Who has provided the reason for our rejoicing.

But consider Christ's statement to the one, "Thy faith hath made thee whole." Is he the only one who remained healed? Did the others discover their leprosy returning as they walked closer to the priests? It would appear not for such is certainly not the point of the passage. Additionally, Jesus declares that ten were cleansed, and there is no indication otherwise.

However, this one man who returned to thank Christ has completed his relationship with Christ and his healing. This man's faith has made him whole in the sense that his healing is more than just in body. The others received their healings; yet, they still missed the fullness of joy found in a personal knowledge and relationship with the One Who brought the healing. The nine saw Jesus as a good means to the desired end where the grateful one gave honor and worship to the One Who brought about the desired end.

What a difference between the two! Are we among the nine or will we be the one? The answer to that is whether we see Jesus as a means to our desires or whether we see Him as One to be desired.
