Is Your Theology Practical?

Over time, people have pursued the study of theology from various perspectives and for specific purposes. Among these approaches are theologies termed Biblical, Black, Confessional, Constructive, Contextual, Covenant, Dogmatic, Ecumenical, Ethical, Federal Vision, Feminist, Historical, Liberal, Mystical, Natural, Normative, Pastoral, Patristic, Philosophical, Post-liberal, Postmodern, Practical, Process, Reformed, Scientific, and Systematic.

Of course, many Bible college students are especially familiar with Systematic Theology because of that course within their academic discipline. However, when the course is over, grade is recorded, and the degree hangs on the wall, "Is Your Theology Practical?"

The study of theology is the study of God, and any study concerning Him needs to find its place in practical, daily living. In fact, study that merely fills the head without practical application to life is wholly impractical. God never intended His Word to be "head-filler." James expresses it clearly when he says,

James 1:22 But be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves.

23 For if any be a hearer of the word, and not a doer, he is like unto a man beholding his natural face in a glass:

24 For he beholdeth himself, and goeth his way, and straightway forgetteth what manner of man he was.

25 But whoso looketh into the perfect law of liberty, and continueth therein, he being not a forgetful hearer, but a doer of the work, this man shall be blessed in his deed.

26 If any man among you seem to be religious, and bridleth not his tongue, but deceiveth his own heart, this man's religion is vain.

27 Pure religion and undefiled before God and the Father is this, To visit the fatherless and widows in their affliction, and to keep himself unspotted from the world.

James' emphasis is on a "religion" (one's expression of faith) which is applied in a practical way. May we all fall under the conviction of living out a very practical theology: simply studying the Bible and doing what it says!
